Christmas lunch

This year, we are having our Christmas lunch at school on Tuesday 13th December. Christmas service

While we are on the subject of Christmas, I just wanted to give you a couple of dates for your diary.

Firstly our Christmas nativity Hosanna Rock! will be on Thursday 8th December at 9.15am and 5.30pm at the school. The performance will include Pre-school and Reception to Year 4. The morning performance will be followed by tea, coffee and mince pies and a raffle organised by the Friends.

Secondly, we are having a Christmas service at St. Peter's Church, led by Reverend Steve on Monday 12th December at 2.15pm. Everyone is very welcome to join us in celebrating the Nativity with traditional readings and carols.

Elm Bank

For the last few years, the children have visited Elm Bank, a home for Senior Citizens to sing Christmas themed songs. The residents absolutely love the interaction with the children and they have invited us again this year. As we will be in Hexham to watch the Oddsocks pantomime The Jungle Book on Wednesday 14th December, we will arrange for the bus to also take us to Elm Bank after the children have had their packed lunch. A letter will be sent out soon with a permission slip to return to school.

Library opening hours

Some parents have enquired about whether the library is open after school. We would love parents and children to use the library. To start off with, the library will be open every Wednesday between 3.05pm and 3.45pm. This will enable you and your child to choose a book and to write it in the book on the desk. Could I ask that the library be left as you would want to find it, with books neatly put away and furniture returned to its place. Last year members of staff frequently had to tidy up following after school library sessions. Please remember, they are busy already without this extra responsibility.

We are incredibly lucky to have been given some funding from the Evans Trust to allow us to improve our outdoor area. The next stage of our improvement is to create an appropriate outdoor learning area for our Reception children. We have also had a generous offer from two parents to repair our lovely Wendy House. At the moment, it is out of bounds for the children but we are hoping that after half term it will have a new lease of life!
