



Humshaugh C of E First School Sport Premium Report 2022-2023

In 2022-2023 the school received £16,360. The funding was used in a variety of ways to further improve and develop teaching and learning of PE across the whole school. We changed our PE and Club Provider to NUFC to start in September 2022, however NUFC were unable to uphold the agreement and did not provide us with a permanent coach until the end of December 2022. As a result, PE teaching and learning was poor and the Headteacher decided to terminate the agreement with NUFC and employ a part time qualified teacher Mr Hulbert to teach PE across Key stage 1 and 2 in addition to leading an extracurricular sports club. Children also had opportunities to take part in Quadkids and Rounders and also a Skipping Festival and Hoopstartz day. Our excellent after school provision has continued and we offer a wide range of free After School Clubs which include Dance, Football, Yoga and Zumba.

We have also focussed on swimming attainment and the children in Years 2 to 4 have been attending weekly swimming lessons throughout the year (as opposed to alternate half terms as in previous years) and the impact is very noticeable. More children have moved into the big pool and more children are able to swim 25 metres on their front and back. Next year, we will actively encourage our children to take part in competitive sport, we will audit equipment and purchase a range of new items, continue to focus on Lower Key Stage 2 swimming attainment, focus on progression in PE with a new PE Lead and focus on participation and enjoyment of sport, following the government plan for children to have at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day.
