Home esafety-important message

It has been brought to my attention that some children have been exposed to an inappropriate YouTube video called <u>3am</u> <u>Challenge</u> while at home. It asks the viewer to complete a variety of challenges at 3am that gradually get more and more disturbing as they progress. As always, please make sure that you know what your child is accessing if they have a tablet or ipad at home. Make sure Parental Controls are set at an appropriate level and if you require any advice our website has various information leaflets about ways to ensure your child is safe on the internet.

School Uniform

At Humshaugh First School there is a standard uniform for children which we encourage them to wear.

Girls

- Grey/black trousers/skirt/pinafore
- White polo shirt
- Red sweatshirt/cardigan
- White, Red, Black or Grey socks or tights
- A red & white gingham dress may be worn in the summer
- Plain black school shoes or boots

Boys

- Grey/black trousers/shorts
- White polo shirt
- Red sweatshirt
- Plain black school shoes or boots

P.E. Kit (Drawstring bag)

PE kits should be kept on pegs. Children will bring their kit home at the end of each half term so it can be washed and returned to school for the start of the new half term.

- Shorts /leggings/track-suit bottoms
- T-shirt (hoodie or sweatshirt for outdoor PE)
- Socks & Trainers

All uniform, PE kits, bags, coats, shoes and wellies need to be labelled with children's names.

Jewellery and Hairstyles

The wearing of jewellery, especially earrings, is not encouraged because of the possible danger to the wearer and to other pupils. NCC has a policy of not allowing earrings to be worn during PE, for reasons of safety (this includes swimming). If your child has their ears pierced and they are unable to take their earrings out, please either remove them for PE and swimming days or provide a roll of plaster so that they cover their earrings for all lessons including physical activity. The school cannot accept responsibility for the safekeeping or removal of any jewellery.

<u>Hair</u>

Children should have long hair tied back at all times during the school day and hair should not be dyed or styled in extreme fashions, including Mohicans and tramlines, during term time.

If possible, we would like parents to provide their child with a <u>clearly labelled pair of wellies that can be kept at school</u> for all types of outdoor activities through the week. We would really like to get the children outside as much as possible and with the changeable weather, school shoes are getting wet and uncomfortable. We will be purchasing some new storage for the corridor to keep the wellies in. If anybody has difficulty providing these please let us know.

Harvest Festival

We would like to invite parents, relatives and friends to our Harvest Festival and Community Soup Lunch on Thursday 28th September. The children will help prepare the vegetables in the morning and parent volunteers will make the soup ready for approximately 1.15pm.
