



Humshaugh Cof E First School Sport Premium Proposed Spend Plan 2021-2022

In 2021-2022 the school will receive £16,360. The funding will be used in a variety of ways to further improve and develop teaching and learning of PE across the whole school. We will continue to work with our School partnership teacher from Active Northumberland who assists in the planning and delivery of PE across Key Stage 1 and 2 and leads a weekly after school sports club for children from Reception to Year 4. We will continue to encourage children to lead healthy and active lifestyles through our teaching and learning and organised events such as Dance Marathons, Hoopstarz and a visit from an inspiration Sports Champion.

We will actively encourage our children to take part in competitive sport. Having already seen the impact of funding from previous years we hope for this year's funding to continue to have a lasting impact on provision of PE and sport within our school. Areas to address in PE this year are to audit equipment and purchase a range of new items, focus on Lower Key Stage 2 swimming attainment, focus on assessment for learning in PE and to focus on participation and enjoyment of sport.
