Free School Meals

If you think your child may be entitled to Free School Meals, you can apply for this benefit

online <u>www.northumberland.gov.uk/fsm</u>, over the telephone on FSM 01670 623592 or by completing a paper application form which is available from our school office or FSM office, Wansbeck Square, Ashington NE63 9XL or email FSM@northumberland.gov.uk.

To be eligible for help you need to be in one of the following categories:

- Receive Income Support (IS) or Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (IBJSA).
- Receive Income Related Employment Allowance (IREA).
- Have an entitlement to Child Tax Credit (CTC), but not Working Tax Credit (WTC) and the family's annual income (as assessed by the Inland Revenue) is not more than £16,190
- Receive support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Receive the guarantee credit element of Pension Credit.

Reception, Years 1 and 2 – why you should still apply for Free School Meals - Since September 2014, all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have been eligible for free school meals. If you are entitled to claim for FSM as detailed below, no matter what year group your child is in, it is important to our school that you register for this benefit. Where a child is entitled to and claims FSM we can register them for Pupil Premium funding – this is currently worth £1,300 a year per pupil for our school. Children entitled to FSM are also entitled to

- free milk at break-time for the time he/she is entitled to free school meals.

Attendance

Please ensure your child is in school every day unless unwell. Parents must contact the school office or leave a message on the answer machine giving a reason for absence.

Routines

Please remember to arrive promptly to school in the morning. The bell is rung for school to start at 8.50am.

Parents should bring their children into the playground for <u>8.45am (no earlier)</u> where they will be escorted into school by Mrs Phillips.

Late book-we have had several entries in the late book this week. Children who come into class late are missing vital instructions which delay them starting their activities.

Please also ensure you arrive on time at <u>3.05pm</u> to pick your child up at the end of the day.

PE this term

Quite a number of children are not bringing a PE kit to leave in school. As the after school sport club has finished, children can bring in their kit at the beginning of a half term and take it home to wash during the holidays.
