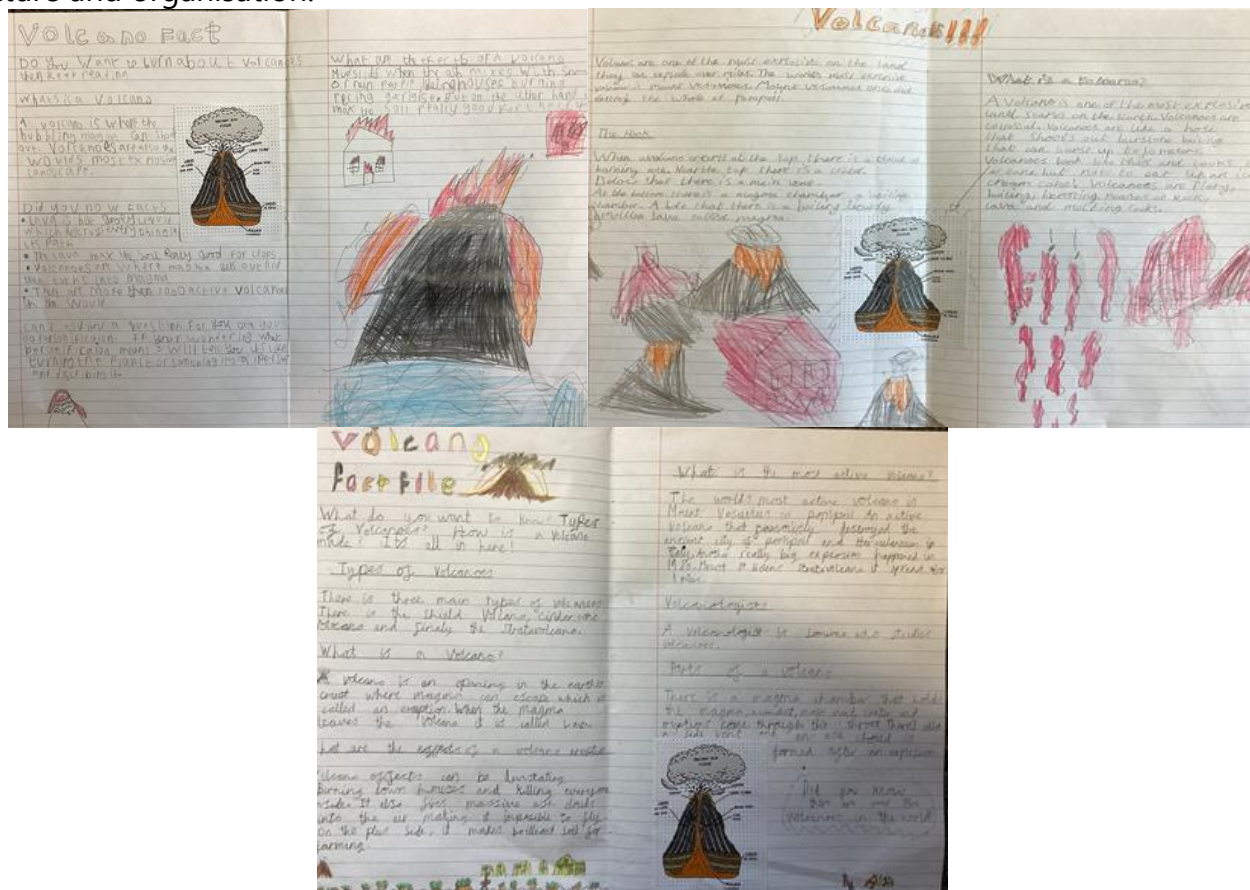
The following is a check list of items that the children will need:

- Wear practical clothes (same as Forest School)
- Wear red school jumper/cardigan
- Wear trainers to school
- In a rucksack/bag
- Bring wellies (ideally ones that reach up to the knee)
- Bring spare socks
- Bring a spare pair of trousers/leggings
- Bring a waterproof coat with a hood (water drips down from the ceiling of the mine)
- Bring hat and gloves as even if the temperature outside is warm, the mine is cold!
- Bring a Packed Lunch including a mid-morning snack
- Bring a refillable water bottle

We know it sounds like a lot of items for one trip but we want to make sure the children have the very best experience and if they get wet, they will be uncomfortable for the rest of the day.

New Parent controls announced for Snapchat and TikTok

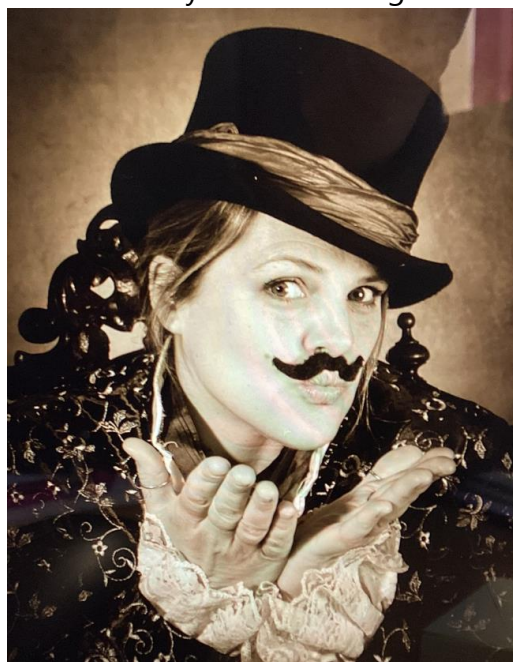
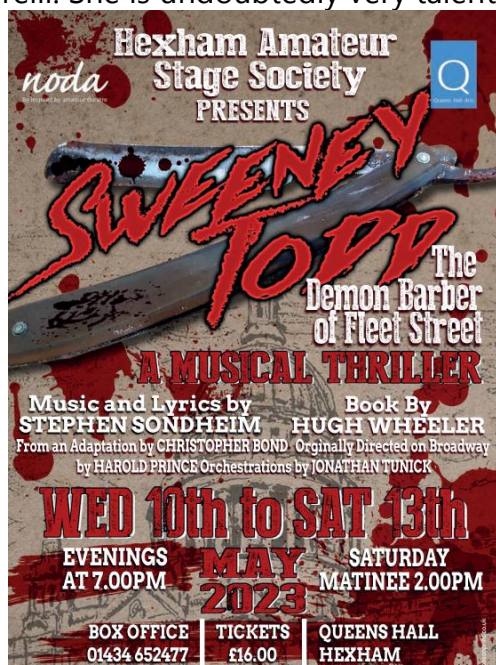
