If your child is a more confident reader please encourage them to read silently but give opportunities for discussing the text.</p>	<p><u>Help at home</u> <u>x tables:</u> Please encourage your children to practise multiplication tables 1-12.These underpin many mathematical concepts. Learning the sequences by heart will assist the children in being able to answer x table questions randomly. <u>Y3:</u> 2,5,10,3,4 <u>Y4:</u> 6,7,8,9,11,12</p>

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
