E-SAFETY

A reminder to parents that we have a very useful e-safety section on our website called Parent Info. This is an information service that is continually updated with articles and advice about all the latest games and apps including TikTok, Fortnite, Roblox and WhatsApp. (click on e-safety/Parents)

We are hearing an increasing number of children referring to sites and games that are not necessarily appropriate for their age. Many sites and apps have age limits and strict guidance.

The children learn about e-safety in school but may need support at home to ensure they are accessing age-appropriate and safe sites and games.

When talking to your child about staying safe on the internet, parents should...

- Remain calm and non-judgemental.
- Talk to them about what they would do if they see nasty content and who they would talk to.
- Be curious - where have they seen this content? Can that channel/account be blocked? Ensure you know how to report content.
- Don't treat 'online' different to real life, to children online is real life. In the same way that we would talk about their day at school, their friends etc. we should have regular discussions about what they are doing online and what to do if something is concerning or upsetting.

COVID-19 UPDATE

To ensure we are keeping school as safe as possible, please can I remind parents to not send their child to school if they or anyone in your household is displaying COVID-19 symptoms. During this time the household should self-isolate for 10 days or until the outcome of a test is received. This would mean siblings would also not attend school.

Main symptoms:

- **a high temperature** – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- **a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste** – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal
