<u>PSHE</u>

We have been incorporating more PSHE into our lessons over the last couple of weeks. This week the children watched a live assembly with the Duchess of Cambridge about 'Kindness' which was streamed on the Oak Academy website. She had a zoom discussion with children from primary school about what is kindness and why we should be kind to each other. We also watched a very old film from the 1960's about a teacher who tried a radical experiment with her class to tackle discrimination. The children were divided into two groups-the blue eyes and the brown eyes and each group took turns in experiencing what is was like to be treated differently because of the colour of their eyes. This film produced a very interesting discussion with our children and is very relevant to the current situation with the 'Black Lives Matter' world-wide protests.

We enjoyed a singing session on Thursday afternoon. It was lovely to hear the children's voices singing some old favourites like 'My Lighthouse', 'May the Road Rise' and 'A Million Dreams'.
