GOVERNMENT'S COVID-19 WINTER PLAN

There has been speculation in the media recently with regard to early closure of schools for Christmas with a reallocation of days from next year or a switch to online learning. Please see the information below which is directly from the Government website.

COVID-19 WINTER PLAN (publishing.service.gov.uk)

Nurseries, schools and colleges should not change their Christmas holidays or close early this term. Parents should continue to send their children to school during term time and students should continue to attend college right up until the end of term —our senior clinicians continue to advise that the best place for children and young people is in education. A time-limited change to social restrictions over Christmas does not require any children to be taken out of school prematurely. The leaders and staff of education settings have been doing an extraordinary job to remain open, keep settings safe and provide education.

Obviously there may be for some schools the need to close as directed by Public Health, the LA or the DFE; but unless this is the case the current guidance and clear direction from the DfE is to remain open up to the end of term.

MESSAGE FROM THE PLAYING FIELD TRUST

A letter from Cressida Cowell

Hi, My name is Cressida Cowell, and I'm the author and illustrator of the How to Train Your Dragon, and The Wizards of Once series, as well as the Emily Brown picture book series. I'm also an Ambassador for The National Literacy Trust. I've been an author now for twenty years, and hundreds of kids, teachers and parents have asked me what I think is the one thing they can do to encourage creativity and develop stories. My answer is always: have a notebook to draw and write just for the fun of it.

What makes this notebook special is that NO ONE is allowed to correct it. Your spelling and grammar and handwriting doesn't matter in this book. What matters is that it's a place for ideas and for FUN. Spend 15 minutes a week (or longer – it's up to you) writing, or drawing in it. You can write stories, or notes from any exciting facts that you've found, or drawings, or comic strips, or ideas for films or little pictures of characters. You can write about books you've read or films that you've watched. This is YOUR notebook, and you can put whatever you like in it.

I started writing and drawing when I was very young, and I've kept notebooks ever since. Some of the story ideas I had about Vikings and dragons eventually became the How to Train Your Dragon book and film series. I still keep notebooks now – for my most recent series, The Wizards of Once, I kept a big A3 scrapbook for five years.

Here you can download some tips and starting points, because sometimes being faced with a blank notebook can be a bit daunting. If you don't need them, that's OK, you can start by yourself. The most important thing is that you enjoy what you're doing.

Keep writing, drawing, and creating!

If your child has brought home a script with highlighted dialogue, please help them to learn their lines by giving them the cues.

We hope to be able to provide costumes for all children. The most we might ask for is a festive jumper or outfit for some of the characters.
