Areas to address

Wrap around care

The recurring theme was that school do not offer enough wrap-around provision.

Response from school

School currently offer *free* after school clubs between Monday and Thursday that finish at 4.15pm. There used to be a later after school provision but the numbers dwindled so much, it was not viable. Since then we have been fortunate that a local childminder has offered later provision for working parents who need it. We always try to do our best to adapt our provision to meet the requests of working parents, however there are also constraints as a small school with regards to staffing and budget.

School sent a proposal to parents before half term regarding the changing of the timings of the school day and extending care until 5.00pm (Monday to Thursday). There has generally been a positive response, however there have also been a range of requests for different end times to the school day because of middle school collection and extra-curricular clubs. Parents will be informed after half term about the final outcome.



<u>Homework</u>

There was a varied amount of feedback regarding homework-some parents say there is too much particularly for Reception children. Some parents have requested paper copies rather than electronic.

Response from school

The teaching staff have met to discuss homework and from September the following will be put into place on a weekly basis.

Reception-Reading books and Phonics games (to be provided by school) Optional Nessy.

Year 1 and 2-Reading books, Nessy and one sheet of maths homework

Years 3 and 4-Reading books, one sheet of Maths or English. Optional Nessy, Maths Whizz and J2E Times Table Blast.

The purpose of homework is to reinforce and consolidate learning that has taken place during the week. It also gently encourages children to prepare for Middle School when the amount of homework is increased.

If parents have any requests or concerns regarding homework, please contact the class teacher who will be more than happy to tailor make homework provision to fit with work and after school commitments.

If children are unable to complete their homework, they do get given the opportunity to do so in school time.

Information about pupil progress

A few requests were made about increased information about pupil progress and the chance to look at children's' work.

Response from school

The standard model for reporting on pupil progress for most First Schools is one parent meeting in the Autumn and Spring term and a written report in the Summer term.

If pupils require intervention or external agency referrals, then teachers do have increased contact with parents regarding pupil progress.

Due to the restrictions of Covid, it was very difficult to invite parents into school to 'look at books' although books were available for parents to look at during parent meetings.

From September, the revised plan will be as follows:

Autumn 1-face to face parent meeting

Autumn 2-brief written summary of progress in Reading, Writing and Maths Spring 1 – brief written summary of progress in Reading, Writing and Maths Spring 2-face to face parent meeting

Summer 2-end of year written report and 'Look at books'



Two dates have been set aside for parents to 'Look at Books' on Monday 11^{th} and Tuesday 12^{th} July 3.05-4.00pm.

Health and Safety
