# ON ANGEL WINGS-HEXHAM ABBEY EVENT INVITATION TO 'ON ANGEL WINGS'

As part of a Cultural Recovery Fund grant, Hexham Abbey has received funding to enable us to host a reopening event. We will coincide this with a town-wide event taking place in Hexham on 26th June. The Abbey's event will be an aerial installation of origami angels placed above the Choirstalls in the Abbey. The angels will symbolise those whose lives have been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. This may involve remembering lives lost in the last year or celebrating those who have helped others. It could be an NHS professional who has stood out to you, a key worker or any individual or group who has helped in any way during the recent challenging times.

We would love to involve members of the community in this project; individuals, local schools and groups are being contacted to make angels and write names of those they wish to remember on the wings. The angels will be elevated in the Abbey and the installation will be available to view during Abbey opening hours from  $26^{th}$  lune.

If you know someone who might like to make and dedicate an angel, we will be hosting workshops in the Abbey on the following days:

Monday 31<sup>st</sup> May, 3pm-5.30pm Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> June, 11am-2pm Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 11am-2pm Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 11am-2pm

Everyone is most welcome to attend and all materials will be provided. These will be drop-in events, where Abbey staff and volunteers will show you how to make an angel. **Children must be supervised by a parent or carer at all times.** If you would like to take part, but are unable to attend on these dates, please get in touch and we can provide details of how to make your angel at home.

The workshops are free but we will be collecting donations on behalf of two local charities. These will be shared equally between the Great North Air Ambulance and Tynedale Hospice at Home. We look forward to welcoming you to the Abbey.
