Unfortunately, attendance has been particularly poor over the last term. We understand that children are sometimes ill and have to be absent from school, however there is an ever-increasing number of Leave of Absence requests for term time holidays and Unauthorised Absences resulting in very poor attendance for some children. There are a number of children whose attendance is **at or below 90%**. If attendance does not improve, then fines will be issued for taking term time holidays and a referral will be made to the Educational Welfare Officer.

Please ensure your child/ren are in school every day.

LATECOMERS

There has been an increase in pupils arriving late to school recently. **School starts at 8.45am** and learning begins immediately. If a child is persistently late then they are missing vital parts of their learning and important instructions and information for the day. Mrs Clark is not always in the office to let latecomers in so please do your very best to ensure that your child/ren are in school on time. We do provide a daily Breakfast Club between 8.00-8.45am. If lateness is due to logistics with older children attending different schools then please consider using our Breakfast Club.

ZIG ZAG LINES

Please **DO NOT** park on the yellow zig zag lines outside school, even to drop off or pick up. 'Stopping' and 'Parking' are both prohibited and could lead to fines and penalty points on your driver's license.

If you are dropping off or picking up your child/ren, please park away from the zig zag lines and join either the queue at the front door for Y1-4 or the back door for Nursery and Reception.

Part-Time Job Opportunity



Role: Sessional Worker (Youth Club) approx 3-9hrs/week

Pay: £13.45/hr + 12.07% annual leave entitlement

Hours: our sessional workers will usually work pre-agreed routine hours on weekday evenings through term time only.

Place of work: sessional workers will be based at one or more of our village hubs, to be agreed at appointment. We hold youth clubs at Otterburn, Bellingham, Humshaugh & Kirkwhelpington.

Working with us: we are a small and mighty team of youth workers and volunteers, overseen by a brilliant voluntary board of trustees. We support the personal and social development of young people aged eight to eighteen by delivering recreational and educational opportunities. We work directly with young people in community buildings like village halls, sports centres and schools across our area of reach. Our young people are at the heart of what we do.

Purpose of the Role: we are recruiting for sessional workers who can help us deliver our regular term time youth clubs in Otterburn, Bellingham, Humshaugh and Kirkwhelpington.

Our sessional workers will report directly to the Youth Worker / Youth Support Worker or Youth Development Worker.

Main responsibilities

- Help to plan and supervise activities, set up and tidy up equipment, sign young people in and out of the club, and evaluate sessions to help improve our service.
- Follow North Tyne Youth's policies and procedures, including for Health & Safety and Safeguarding.
- Communicate effectively with staff, volunteers and young people's families.
- Undergo training and personal development as agreed with the Youth Development Worker.
- Complete formal and informal supervision and appraisal as agreed with the Youth Development Worker.
