GOVERNMENT GUIDANCE

Yesterday the Government published their first set of guidance for school opening in September. The staff, governors and I are currently devising a plan that adheres to the guidelines with the support of the Diocese and Northumberland County Council. As soon as we are able, we will communicate our risk assessment and plan for fully opening in September with you, however the finer details may still be under review through the summer holiday as further guidance is expected in August. Please ensure that you check your emails regularly throughout the summer holiday, to avoid missing important communication about school routines.

Although we expect to open to all children from September, certain aspects of the school day and our extra-curricular provision may be different to usual. Our top priority as always is the safety of pupils and staff and ensuring that we are strictly following the guidelines to limit the risk of a Covid-19 outbreak in school.

HOME LEARNING

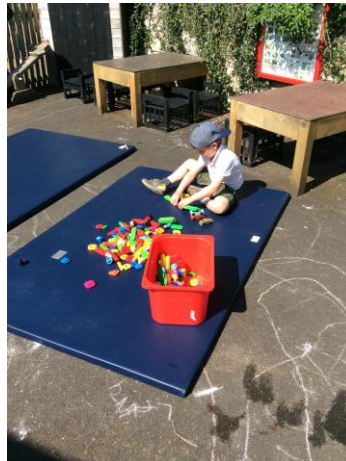
We would like to share some of the amazing things that children are doing at home. Lily and Lewis have been enjoying doing some '#DrawWithRob' pictures.
