Please find attached the planning overview for this half term by subject, so you can see the coverage. The children are really excited to be in their new Class and I'm sure we will have lots of fun whilst learning. A very warm welcome to our two new pupils into school and Class 2, Milada and Solomiia. Everyone has been very happy to be back in school for the first week, and the children are already working hard!

Our Topic this half term is 'Australia' and we have some lovely story books to explore in Literacy, including 'Diary of a Wombat' and 'The Koala Who Could.' We will be finding out all about Australia in Geography as well.

Homework will be set from Week 3 and will be either Maths or English based. Some children will receive Phonics homework to consolidate learning.

Spellings will be managed in school under a new scheme, so will no longer be sent home to practice. The common high frequency words will be a focus in Class.

Reading books have been sent home today and will be changed once a week. The reading books will consist of one Read, Write inc. phonics book and a 'bookbag' book that contains the same phoneme (sound) as the phonics book. In addition, children will be able to select a library book once a week.
