SCHOOL DINNERS

A message from Newbrough Primary School, our school dinner provider:

The price for a school meal has been £2.00 for the past 10 years but we have seen a sharp rise of just under 13% in the cost of ingredients over the past few months. Reluctantly, we have taken the decision to put up the price of school meals from September. The cost for a dinner will now be £2.30 per day or £11.50 per week.

This still represents excellent value for money. The children are given a main course with a choice of vegetables plus salad and bread plus a choice of pudding.

Please remember that <u>Universal Free School</u> meals are <u>only for children in Reception</u>, <u>Year 1 and Year 2</u>. If your child is moving into Year 3 or 4 from September, they will have to pay for their school meal unless they are eligible for Pupil Premium and Free School Meals.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Please ensure you order uniform from www.schooltrends.co.uk as soon as possible to ensure it arrives before the summer holidays.

We are seeing a growing number of variations with regards to uniform. The following is a reminder about the standard uniform for children which we would like them to wear.

Girls

- Grey/black trousers/skirt/pinafore
- White polo shirt
- Red sweatshirt/cardigan
- White, Red, Black or Grey socks or tights
- A red & white gingham dress may be worn in the summer
- Plain black school shoes or boots

Boys

- Grey/black trousers/shorts
- White polo shirt
- Red sweatshirt
- Plain black school shoes or boots

P.E. Kit (Drawstring bag)

PE kits should be kept on pegs. Children will bring their kit home at the end of each half term so it can be washed and returned to school for the start of the new half term.

- Shorts /leggings/track-suit bottoms
- T-shirt (hoodie or sweatshirt for outdoor PE)
- Socks & Trainers

All uniform, PE kits, bags, coats, shoes and wellies need to be labelled with children's names.

Jewellery and Hairstyles

The wearing of jewellery, especially earrings, is not allowed because of the possible danger to the wearer and to other pupils. NCC has a policy of not allowing earrings to be worn during PE, for reasons of safety (this includes swimming). The school accepts no responsibility for the safekeeping or removal of any jewellery or watches.

Children should have long hair tied back at all times during the school day and hair should not be dyed or styled in extreme fashions, during term time.
